This provided an opportunity for families to hear more about our curriculum model, opportunities within, outside and beyond Riverside and also other organisations that exist to support pupils and families as they move through the school and transition into adulthood. You may also be interested to know that we have updated our Resources for Families section of the website to include advice on how to ensure your child is on the Learning Disability Register so that GP practices are aware of any reasonable adjustments they may need. There is also information on Annual Health Checks if your child is aged 14+ and how to complete a Hospital Passport to help medical staff support your child should they need to visit. If your child is much earlier in their journey (our youngest pupil is still only 3!), our aim is to immerse them in an educational experience that makes them want to bounce into school in the mornings, whilst learning skills that stand them in good stead in a range of contexts. Unless we

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are able to support your child transfer and generalise skills beyond Riverside, we believe that something is missing. This links to the whole premise of our Personal Learning Plans (PLPs) and Happiness Passports. In essence, we will always focus on the things that make the biggest difference to you and your families' lives.

One element of this is the Annual Review process and, if your child's Annual Review is on the 24th February, you will have received a letter accompanying their progress report detailing the process and purpose of the review. We continue to work in partnership with Local Authority colleagues to ensure that this process is as streamlined and clear as possible for all parties.

There are so many things to look forward to next half term and, whichever site, phase or pathway your child is in, we will never tire of finding new ways to excite and engage them; to widen their worlds and enable them to Be All That They Can Be.
